Take some time to think...

You may find that filling in the form is something that takes some time over several sessions as you really consider what you would like to do. The passing of a person is a time of grief and also a time of reflection, people in attendance want to remember, its your personality they look for and what it really means to be you.

Comfort and Hope

It's worth remembering that those who will gather at your funeral will be comprised of friends and family; being flexible by not defining every last detail also has merits. The key aspect of planning is to set aside time in a quiet place where you are unlikely to be interrupted. Some low level background music (not radio or TV) can help to elicit more ideas and answers to the questions.
